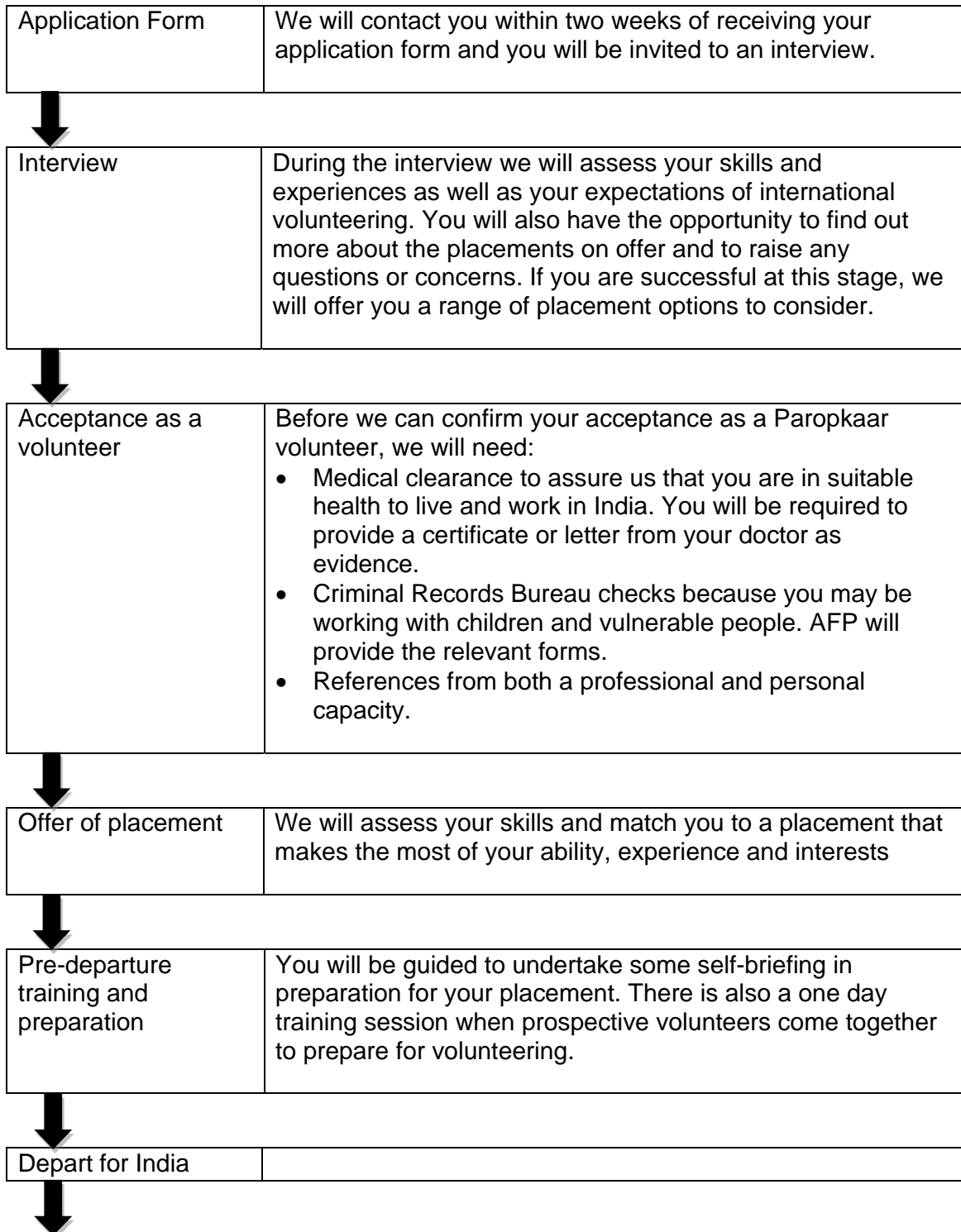




Overview of your Volunteer Journey





During placement	<p>Before going to your placement you will have 2 days orientation with the AFP Programme Manager based in India. Throughout your placement, you will receive support and encouragement from both our staff in India and your host organisation. We will take care of arranging internal travel, where necessary, and will find adequate and safe accommodation.</p> <p>We aim to send groups of volunteers on placement together. This means that during your time in India you will benefit from the support and advice of fellow volunteers.</p>
End of placement	<p>After completing your placement you are required to submit placement evaluation. This is important to understand what impact you have had and also to contribute to developing future volunteering placements.</p> <p>When you return home, we can provide a reference based on your time as a volunteer.</p>
Stay involved with AFP on your return	<p>The Paropkaar Programme provides sustainable opportunities for you to use and share knowledge, skills and understanding.
